3. Clerk's Report

4. Updates on current matters

Senior Cllr Tarling suggests using it as a fund-raising opportunity for JPC, perhaps handing out information on what has been achieved throughout the year and encouraging other children to get involved.

- e) Sway Parish Assembly
 Cllr Hattie has volunteered to speak at the Parish Assembly. Clerk to work with her on words.
- f) Sway Spring Clean

5. Other matters for discussion

Chair – the Post Office has been sold to Budgens and the post office has been closed. This is a very important public service. The Clerk explained about the public consultation. Council discussed sending in a response, to explain all the ways it is beneficial.

DECISION: The Council should draft a response to the Post Office in support of opening

another branch somewhere in Sway. This was approved unanimously.

MotP – there is a film competition at spudWORKS, asking for young people to make a film about things they are doing to support the environment, showing their contribution to making a difference to the local community, the theme is waste. If the JPC enter the film competition, the winner would to be shown at the film festival. Closing date is 8th May.

Council discussed the angle for them. All their work on the anti-littering, cleaning up Sway and educating residents about being clean. They would need to create a strong story, with an inspiring message, showing a positive difference – for all forms of waste – and solutions!

7. The Shared Forest: an activity-based session to learn about Commoning

Lyndsey Stride introduced the lottery funded project, commissioned by the Commoners Defence Association, which aims to maintain the unique commoning heritage of the New Forest and develop a programme of learning and discovery that will increase public support and understanding for the commoning way of life.

The councillors worked through activities and learning, and viewed the Commoning Voices exhibition, to learn about commoning and to become Shared Forest ambassadors. Upon completion of the session, each councillor was presented with a certificate of achievement and a Shared Forest badge.
